MYANMAR: DEATH, DESTRUCTION AND DESPERATION MIRROR 2017 ATROCITIES – UN REPORT



A report published on Tuesday by the UN Human Rights Office said the worsening crisis in Myanmar, particularly Rakhine State, provides a stark reminder of the atrocities committed by the military in 2017, pointing to

increased killings, torture, razing of villages, and mass forced displacement. Between the 2021 military coup and 20 August 2025, credible sources have verified the killing of some 7,100 people by the military, of whom about a third

were women and children. At least 29,560 people have been arrested on political grounds and over 22,000 remain in detention without respect for fair trial and judicial guarantees in military-controlled courts.

DHAKA, ICRC FOR STRENGTHENING COOPERATION ON ROHINGYAS

Bangladesh and International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) today showed interest to further increase ongoing support for forcibly displaced Rohingyas and host communities.

The interest was showed when the newly appointed ICRC Head of Delegation in Bangladesh Nicolas Paul Albin Fleury presented his credential to Foreign Affair Adviser Md Touhid Hossain at the foreign ministry here, said a ministry’s press release.

During the meeting, they also exchanged views on strengthening cooperation between Bangladesh and the ICRC in areas of humanitarian assistance, disaster management and international humanitarian law.

The Adviser assured the government’s continued support with the ICRC which has been operational in Bangladesh since 2010. Fleury also called on Foreign Secretary Asad Alam Siam and discussed the ICRC’s ongoing and planned activities in Bangladesh. Foreign Secretary, chair of the National IHL Committee of Bangladesh, commended ICRC on its assistance in the work of the Committee. He also discussed Bangladesh’s ongoing involvement in the Global IHL Initiative of ICRC. Fleury, a Swiss national, has had a distinguished career with the ICRC, serving in Ukraine, Nagorno-Karabakh, Central Asia, the Caucasus, and the Balkans, as well as at the ICRC Headquarters in Geneva.
